 - b. **Which of these sins do we see most reflected in the modern world today?**

 - c. **Compare this list to Galatians 5:19-20. What are the connections?**

5. **Read John 15:1-10.**
 - a. **What does it mean to "abide in Christ?" Consider how Jesus helps explain this in v. 7 and vv. 9-10.**

 - b. **What is the fruit the Father wants us to bear? (See Galatians 5:22-23.)**

 - c. **What are some ways you have been intentional about abiding in Christ?**

 - d. **What are some common ways you can be distracted or pulled away from abiding in Christ?**

 - e. **What will it look like for you to abide in Christ in this upcoming week?**
