- 3. What is your general strategy for dealing with temptation? How it it working for you?
- 4. How do you respond to the idea that God uses Satan's temptations to test us? How might this knowledge help you the next time you're facing temptation?
- 5. Read 1 Corinthians 10:13.
 - a. Is it encouraging or discouraging to know that your temptations are common? Why?
 - b. How might this knowledge help you the next time you're facing temptation?
 - c. What is meant by "way of escape"? Can you give an example?
- 6. Read Exodus 15:19-16:8. Make note of any observations or comments you have.
 - a. How do you respond to seeing Israel grumble so soon after the Red Sea event?
 - b. How do you think you'd have responded if you were among the people?
 - c. What other important lessons come out of this passage?
- 7. Read Hebrews 4:14-5:10. Make note of any observations or comments you have.
 - a. Other than His temptation in the wilderness, what other events in Jesus' live are being described in 5:7-8?
 - b. According to 4:14-16, what is the connection between Jesus being tempted and us "holding fast our confession"?
 - c. What is meant by Jesus being "made perfect" in 5:9, and why does this matter?
- 8. Who are the tempted people in your life whom you have the opportunity to help? What might it look like for you to model Jesus to them?
- 9. What difference does the high priesthood of Jesus make on your daily Christianity? What difference should it make?
- 10. Is it wise to prepare for temptation? If so, what might that look like for you?
