



1. What insight, principle, or observation from the message did you find most helpful, most challenging, or most troubling? Please explain.
2. What is the biggest or most intricate thing you've ever made? (A model, a meal, a house...) Reflecting on the process, how does this help you praise God for His creative power?
3. Read Psalm 33:6, John 1:1-5, and 2 Timothy 3:16-17.
  - a. Other than in creation, how else is God's word used?
  - b. What does this tell us about the way we study the Bible, which is God's Word recorded for us?
  - c. What does this tell us about who Jesus is?
4. Read Genesis 1:1; Romans 1:20; Colossians 1:16; Hebrews 11:3; Revelation 4:11, 10:6.
  - a. We heard on Sunday that people in ancient cultures worshipped the created things, rather than the Creator. While we may not worship the sun or the moon, how does a similar tendency show up in our culture today?
  - b. Where specifically are you tempted to worship created things rather than the creator? How does Genesis 1 help you in this regard?
5. Consider the discussion on science and evolution.
  - a. What's your background or experience with thinking about these things?
  - b. How did you respond to the ideas that the founders of modern science were essentially all Bible believers, or that more and more scientists today are rejecting Darwinian evolution?
  - c. Why don't you think this would be talked about, publicly, by more scientists today?
6. What tends to be your exposure or interaction with God's creation? What are some ways you can deliberately engage with creation in a way that spurs you to worship the Creator?
