

1. LOVING SOMEONE YOU'VE NEVER SEEN

- a. Having not seen Jesus...
- b. ...we love Him

2. BELIEVING IN SOMEONE YOU DON'T SEE

- a. Not seeing Jesus today...
- b. ...we believe in Him...
- c. ...and rejoice in Him...
- d. ...because of the hope of our future salvation.

3. LOVE IN THE PRESENT TENSE

- a. Faith means more than nodding "yes"
- b. Pursuing joy in Jesus

- 1. What insight, principle, or observation from the message did you find most helpful, most challenging, or most troubling? Please explain.
- 2. Do you find it difficult to love someone you've never seen (namely Jesus)? Why or why not?
 - a. Is there any way that needing hope and faith (as we have not seen Him), has deepened your love for Jesus, and your anticipation for His coming?
 - b. Do you think not seeing Jesus until the last day will make that day all the more sweet and joyful? Why?
- 3. On Sunday we learned about the need for deep love for Jesus
 - a. Read 1 Corinthians 13:4-13. Discuss this passage in light of Sunday's message
 - b. Why do you think love is greater than faith & hope?
 - c. Do you think this love Paul is writing about is only love for other Christians, or love also for Jesus Christ? Does verse 7 point to a love for Jesus & His coming?
 - d. Think of the connections between verse 7 & verse 13. How does love for Jesus & His appearing help to create hope, faith, and perseverance in us? How does this help explain why love is greater than hope & faith?
 - e. Now plug all of this in to Sunday's sermon. Should we think of love & faith as things that can be separate? Also use 1 Corinthians 13:2 to help you here.
- 4. If someone you knew did not feel love for/joy in Jesus, how would you give them advice on how to grow in that? How could you use the following verses to encourage them?
 - a. John 14:23-24
 - b. 1 John 2:15-16
 - c. John 15:9-11
 - d. Psalm 119:174
- 5. Read the following verses: Romans 14:17; 15:13; 1 Thessalonians 1:6.
 - a. Again, notice the connections between joy, faith, hope trust & love.
 - b. Where does this all ultimately come from?
- 6. Pray together that you would grow a love for Jesus through seeing Him in His Word, and that this would lead to persevering faith that is refined like gold at His coming.
